Program Outline

Rural Health Care Student Immersion Week is designed for rising junior and senior students in SND sponsored high schools who are seriously considering a career in health care. The maximum number of participants from each of the three 2020 participating schools (NDCL, NDA-KY and NDA-Toledo) is four students with one chaperone per school.

Immersion Activities: There is no charge for participation in any learning activities or programming.

Health Care Activities Include:

- Job shadowing;
- Ride-along home health and in-home Hospice visits;
- Participation in many of the activities of the Northeast Kentucky Area Health Education Center's (AHEC) Rural Health Scholars program (see below and visit this link for more information: http://www.neahec.org/health_careers_promotion/rural_health_scholars.aspx);
- Participation in a Discharge Planning Lab; and
- A service component yet to be determined but could include creating small quilts for newborns in the Labor & Delivery Unit. Sr. Judi Lambert is exploring other needs/opportunities.

Other experiences include:

- Mass at Jesus Our Savior Church, Morehead
- Visit Newman Center at Morehead State University
- Orientation and history/mission presentation about St. Claire HealthCare
- Cook-out at the home of Donald Lloyd, President/CEO of St. Claire HealthCare

Another possible activity is for St. Claire providers that are clinical faculty to meet with students that are considering a pre-med/medical school track and advise them of things to do now and going forward to improve their chances of being accepted into medical school.

Northeast Kentucky AHEC will register the students and help facilitate their rotations. AHEC will also provide some of the programming during the week (Tuesday through Thursday) through its Rural Health Scholars Program. The Rural Health Scholars Program is designed for high school students who live

within the 17-county Northeast Kentucky AHEC service region and are interested in pursuing a health care career after high school. **They usually run this program in July but are willing to move the program to June so that SND students can participate in parts of the program.** Typically 15 to 20 rising juniors and seniors participate in the Rural Health Scholars Program.

Rural Health Scholars Program events the SND students could participate in include:

- Teambuilding Activities
- Career Presentations
- Interactive Workshop/Activity
- Skills Workshops
- Recorded Surgery Viewing

Other Rural Health Scholars Program activities may include:

- Hike to Lockegee Rock
- Movie @ Morehead Cinemas
- Kayaking at Eagle Lake
- MSU Recreation Center

Room and Board: St. Claire will pay for dorm rooms and provide all meals while in Morehead.

- Students and chaperones will stay in the dorms at Morehead State University
 - Two students per double room; one chaperone in single room.
 - Boys and girls will be separated by either dorms or floors and provided with a common area to gather during free time.
- Students must bring their own bedding (XL twin sheets) and towels. More details available soon.

- Proof of automobile liability insurance for any vehicle parked on MSU campus must be provided by owner of vehicle.
